3 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Mrs. Scrimalli.

4 Mr. Nardozzi, Mr. Hallinan. Mr. Burke.

5 MR. BURKE: Present.

6 ATTY. CUMMINGS. Mr. Verrastro.

7 MR. VERRASTRO: Present.

8 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Mr. Dempsey.

9 MR. DEMPSEY: Present.

10 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Mr. McHale.

11 MR. MCHALE: Here.

12 ATTY. CUMMINGS: There's a quorum.

13 Public comment on agenda items.

14 MR. MCHALE: Does anybody have any
15 comments on the agenda items tonight?

16 (No response.)

17 MR. MCHALE: Seeing none.

18 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Motion to approve
19 the minutes of the last meeting.

20 MR. DEMPSEY: I'll make the motion.

21 MR. BURKE: Second.

22 MR. MCHALE: I have a motion and a
23 second. On the question.

24 (No response.)

25 MR. MCHALE: All those in favor

1 signify by saying aye.

2 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

3 MR. MCHALE: Opposed.

4 (No response.)

5 MR. MCHALE: The ayes have it and
6 so moved.

7 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Motion to approve
8 and pay the open bills.

9 MR. BURKE: I'll make a motion.

10 MR. DEMPSEY: Second it.

11 MR. MCHALE: I have a motion and a
12 second. On the question. Quickly on the
13 question, in addition to the bills that were
14 left out for everybody, we do have one addition
15 for Andrews Air Duct Cleaning.

16 Just to give you a little bit of a
17 background, it's for \$8,400 that when we were
18 cleaning the gym floor, redoing the gym floor,
19 a lot of the sand went into the vents on top of
20 when we had some work done a year and a half
21 ago when we had the problem with some of the
22 steel structures. We were in bad shape on our
23 ducts so we had to have a full cleaning done.

24 They were here several days over the
25 weekend. So the \$8,400 is going to be in

1 addition to the other bills that were left out
2 for the agenda. Anybody else on the question?

3 (No response.)

4 MR. MCHALE: All those in favor
5 signify by saying aye.

6 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

7 MR. MCHALE: Opposed.

8 (No response.)

9 MR. MCHALE: The ayes have it and so
10 moved.

11 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Next is item number
12 six public comment on nonagenda items.

13 MR. MCHALE: Anybody like to address
14 Council tonight?

15 MR. HETMAN: Good evening as always
16 folks. Gerard Hetman from Lackawanna County's
17 Community Relations Department. Just two
18 really quick items this evening. First as we
19 enter the middle part of October, the county is
20 entering its annual budget season.

21 So how it works is, this coming
22 Thursday, October 15th the Commissioners will
23 release the tentative 2016 General Fund Budget
24 to the public for review. We don't have an
25 exact time on press conference yet. But that

1 will be announced shortly, probably tomorrow.
2 We'll get it out on social media as soon as we
3 can.

4 And then coming up in the following
5 weeks, the Commissioners will have their annual
6 series of four budget hearings. They're open
7 to the public. The first is Tuesday, October
8 20th, 11 a.m. in the Commissioner's conference
9 room in the Lackawanna County Administration
10 Building in Scranton; and then Wednesday,
11 October 21st at 6:30 p.m. at the Mayfield
12 Borough Building; and October 22nd, 4:30 p.m.
13 at the Moosic Borough Building and Thursday,
14 October 22nd, 6:30 p.m. at the Springfield
15 Township Building.

16 The hearings again, are open to the
17 public. And as soon as we get information that
18 we have with a copy of the budget -- normally
19 our department writes a budget narrative, kind
20 of like the budget in brief written form. And
21 also depending on what it looks like, we do
22 some charts and graphs, some visuals. We'll
23 get those to your office as soon as we have it.

24 And then my next appearance at
25 Council, I'll give my annual brief but

1 informative hopefully synopsis on what the
2 budget looks like that's proposed for 2016. So
3 that's the first thing.

4 And the second thing this may be
5 particularly helpful with the Borough you're
6 from my understanding newly developing a
7 website. On the county website we just got a
8 new feature last week called One Stop Document
9 Shop. Its official title. The public title is
10 the Document Download Shop.

11 Really simply it's a listing of all
12 the county offices, agencies, and departments.
13 And under each name of office or agency you can
14 just click and access any forms or documents
15 that the row officers or directors believe
16 should be available to the public or the public
17 would need.

18 Some departments and offices have
19 more than others. There is only one or two for
20 the prison I think. But for the court system
21 there is maybe 30, 35 documents. So we think
22 it's a big help. Two things, it fills a
23 feature that was featured on the last county
24 website before it was redesigned in 2012. And
25 people actually asked us, where did that

1 document shop section go.

2 So it's back on there. It's a
3 little pink button on the right side of the
4 home page. And just click it and access many
5 different documents. We've also seen it on the
6 websites for other agencies, branches of
7 government, state, local, federal pages. So we
8 just think it fills a good need for the
9 community. That's all we have. Thank you.

10 MR. MCHALE: Thank you, Mr. Hetman.

11 MR. BURKE: Thanks, Gerard.

12 MR. MCHALE: Anybody else?

13 Mr. Duncan.

14 MR. DUNCAN: I just want to make
15 sure everybody got the minutes from the
16 September neighborhood watch in their e-mail
17 and they were able to open the attachments. I
18 know Mr. Hallinan I just copy the body of the
19 minutes. He can't open the attachments in his
20 account.

21 And then, Vito, were you able to
22 open yours as well? I just want to make sure.
23 And then next week the 19th will be the next
24 neighborhood watch meeting. So hopefully we
25 can get some responses. We're going to have

1 the Dunmore Fire Department as guest speakers.
2 October is Fire Safety Month as I mentioned
3 previously. And Chief DeNaples said he would
4 have two of his guys come down and just talk to
5 the group about, you know, fire safety issues
6 within their residences and everything.

7 And last year they put on a -- they
8 really did a nice presentation. And then I
9 talked to the Chief. And you said you'll talk
10 to Didge about the stop sign issue at Warren
11 and Ward. We have a situation where I got a
12 message from a neighbor that the stop sign was
13 completely overgrown.

14 She was walking her grandson to
15 school. A guy didn't see -- know the stop sign
16 was there. Stopped midway through then
17 intersection. He felt so guilty the guy
18 stopped and went back apologetically. I went
19 down the street and I was telling the Chief
20 you can't really see the stop sign. The view
21 is just completely enveloped. The sidewalk and
22 everything is just overgrown with vegetation so
23 hopefully we can get that corrected.

24 And lastly the next Dunmore
25 Neighborhood Watch meeting will be Monday,

1 October 19th at 7:00. And again, we'll have
2 the guest speakers from the fire department.
3 Thank you.

4 MR. MCHALE: Thank you.

5 MS. HALLINAN: Kelly Burke Hallinan,
6 1723 Madison Avenue, Dunmore since 1961. I
7 started to come to Council in May of this year
8 regarding illegally altered single family homes
9 that have been turned into three unit apartment
10 buildings in my neighborhood.

11 We did get signatures of over 30
12 other neighbors. And I presented a petition at
13 the beginning of June that I still haven't
14 received anything back from Council on.

15 MR. MCHALE: I have seen it. What
16 would you like back, Mrs. Hallinan?

17 MS. HALLINAN: Well, aren't you
18 supposed to act on a petition from the
19 taxpayers?

20 MR. MCHALE: Vito, can you and I sit
21 tomorrow?

22 MS. HALLINAN: Okay. Also I'm a
23 little embarrassed tonight. I'm not usually
24 embarrassed to speak. Before I inform you of
25 the subject matter and what I discovered, I

1 would like to let Council know and anyone in
2 the audience to know that I have the
3 information, documentation, and proof on me if
4 anyone cares to see it.

5 I've been asking for a determination
6 which I need to go in front of the Zoning Board
7 from Council to get from the Zoning and Code
8 Enforcement Officer. I received a second
9 opinion, not a determination which I can't take
10 an opinion in front of the Zoning Board.
11 Normally I pay the fee for the permit to do
12 that without a determination.

13 MR. MCHALE: Can I stop you, Mrs.
14 Hallinan? Tommy, we set to do this last month.
15 To my knowledge another letter was sent saying
16 that --

17 ATTY. CUMMINGS: That the opinion
18 constitutes determination.

19 MS. HALLINAN: Okay. And you
20 received a copy of it?

21 MR. MCHALE: I have not been around
22 for the last week and a half, ma'am.

23 MS. HALLINAN: You were cc'd on it.
24 That's the only reason --

25 MR. MCHALE: I'm just telling you I

1 haven't seen it yet. But that's why I asked
2 Mr. Cummings.

3 MS. HALLINAN: Okay. Well --

4 ATTY. CUMMINGS: I will issue an
5 opinion of record at the meeting that the
6 documents received regardless of what they say
7 constitute the final and full determination of
8 Dunmore's Code Officer and Zoning Officer.

9 MS. HALLINAN: Okay. Well, within
10 the determination I was given an application
11 for rental license that appears to have dates
12 and things changed on it. I also was given a
13 copy of a fire insurance policy from 2005 which
14 was paid and changed. It's an amendment.

15 I tried to tell you guys I lived
16 there since 1961. I know who was there, who
17 wasn't there. So I don't know why anyone that
18 knows me would think -- plus all the
19 information I gave which as I said I won't do
20 that anymore because it just seems to
21 disappear. No one remembers getting it. No
22 one remembers what was on it. No one looks
23 into anything that I ask at the bottom of the
24 information.

25 This was an amendment to the policy.

1 The policy was originally purchased in
2 November. A payment was made to make it a
3 three unit in 2005, seven months later. No
4 insurance policy gets paid in seven months.
5 You either do it yearly, half year, quarterly.
6 It was a seven-month payment.

7 It is an amendment. It even has the
8 word previous on it showing that it was an
9 amendment. These are all facts I got to show
10 that the house next door to me which I asked
11 for the six homes and for some reason it keeps
12 going back to the house next door to me.

13 I told you the first time I came I
14 have a message on my answering machine from the
15 Code Enforcement Officer that says there's no
16 amendment to your block and I allowed a kitchen
17 to be put in the third floor of this home
18 sometime around or after 2005.

19 So this is what I'm trying to show
20 you. I have proof that there was no third
21 floor apartment there. I have pictures showing
22 there's no porch there. There's no meter
23 there. The meter that is there wasn't even
24 introduced to the area until after 2004. It's
25 a readerless meter, different than all the

1 other meters that are on a house. I have
2 everything right here if anyone wants to see
3 it.

4 Anything I speak about, you know, I
5 told you I worked with the department in
6 Harrisburg. I met with insurance people. I
7 don't come up and say things that I don't know
8 are fact besides the fact that I lived in that
9 house even when I was married I had disabled
10 parents. I was there every day of my life.

11 So I know who was there, who owned
12 the house. Another thing is, they're telling
13 me that it can't be proven because the
14 person -- the prior owner is dead and his
15 brother lives too far away. Well, his wife
16 lives in Throop. And she was also owner of the
17 house in 2005.

18 She was actually an owner until 2008
19 until they got divorced -- 2006 until they got
20 divorced from the settlement. So all the
21 information I got means absolutely nothing.
22 And why I'm embarrassed is, my tax money is
23 going to pay people that are giving this kind
24 of information out.

25 There's dates. There an actual date

1 on a permit on a rental license for 2004. The
2 person didn't even own the house until 2012.
3 How could something be backdated like that? I
4 have an inspector underwriters which is a state
5 inspection; is that correct? Is that a state
6 inspector?

7 MR. LORINCE: Yes.

8 MR. VERRASTRO: No.

9 MS. HALLINAN: Okay, well, I have a
10 signed inspection report from Mr. Forconi{sic}.
11 Is he a state inspector?

12 MR. VERRASTRO: No. They're
13 subcontracted to us. They're not state
14 inspector --

15 MS. HALLINAN: But they're certified
16 from the state.

17 MR. VERRASTRO: They're certified.

18 MS. HALLINAN: They are certified
19 from the state. Okay. I have on there numbers
20 that were changed. It says a three story --
21 two story, three-unit apartment. And the two
22 is changed to a three. I have everything on me
23 right here. So I don't have to go to zoning.

24 I know exactly who I could give all
25 of this stuff to. And I don't have to pay

1 thousands of dollars and get dragged through a
2 court system for years to prove anything. I
3 have all the proof. As I said, I've been there
4 since 1961. So there are six homes on the
5 block that were illegally converted against
6 zoning ordinance after 2000 when the ordinance
7 became effective.

8 The 2005 documentation that
9 Mr. Lorince gave you in June to prove that
10 was -- that is simply for code. That's simply
11 for structure and the code of the structures
12 which has nothing to do with my argument. Now
13 this three unit house that is next door to me
14 that I got this opinion determination on was
15 only one of the six. But this house is 7 feet
16 away from my house. And everyone knows what
17 I've dealt with.

18 Now, there still are rats. All the
19 minutes from the meetings have been posted
20 online except the ones where I said rats.

21 MR. MCHALE: The ones on our
22 website?

23 MS. HALLINAN: Yeah.

24 MR. MCHALE: That's an oversight.
25 We send every one. Mike and I had a meeting

1 about that. Every one that I had in my e-mail
2 I sent. So we're still trying to follow up on
3 everything. I apologize if there is one
4 missing. That's not on purpose. There's not a
5 conspiracy there. We understand exactly what
6 you are going through. You've explained it
7 fantastically.

8 You explained it fantastically. And
9 we've told you how much -- you know, what we
10 can do next. We understand your plight. I
11 told you I have a similar situation that I'm
12 dealing with. Mr. Cummings, is her next step
13 zoning?

14 ATTY. CUMMINGS: The request was for
15 the documents, okay? They might be right,
16 wrong, or indifferent. What I directed was
17 make a photocopy of your documents and deliver
18 them with the letter that specifically states
19 determination so it would be without question
20 appealable, reenforced of record tonight so it
21 is appealable. But I -- the request was to
22 produce the file. That's what we produced. If
23 it's --

24 MR. MCHALE: No, absolutely. I'm
25 just looking -- trying to get to where you want

1 to go. You want a determination on all six
2 homes? You said you know your next step. So I
3 assume that's zoning. I'm not -- you know, you
4 tell us. We're trying to -- we get told one
5 thing on their side and we hear from you.
6 Obviously we're not the final body at least
7 that's what I'm told.

8 MS. HALLINAN: I know, excuse me.
9 But with all due respect, when I tell you that
10 the homes have been illegally altered and I
11 have multi-list realtors. I mean seriously,
12 Google has -- Google Earth -- all I did was go
13 to Google Earth when this began in what, July
14 of 2013. I Google Earthed the houses. There
15 were no three unit apartments.

16 There were no extra meters. You
17 know, you just click the time clock on the left
18 and it takes it back as far as 2008. And I'm
19 being told in the determination that they have
20 proof that this house for decades had a third
21 apartment. I told you the names. Q.J. Carey's
22 two aunts lived there.

23 I used to cut the grass. I used to
24 play with him when he was little. His two
25 elderly aunts lived there. Come on. This is

1 ridiculous. It's ridiculous what you're
2 allowing to happen in the borough.

3 The neighborhoods are going. I told
4 you before the kids are going. Over 43 percent
5 of the houses are rental units. Dunmore is not
6 making any money off that. If I was sitting
7 there, I would want to see the pictures and
8 proof of everything that I said tonight, which
9 I have right here.

10 But, you know, you feel like a fool.
11 You want to leave the community. You don't
12 want to support your local government. You
13 don't want to vote. When everything I've
14 worked for -- we've worked very hard for this
15 home. We put thousands and thousands of
16 dollars in, plus the pride. There's no pride.

17 You can't have any pride when you
18 have, you know, six and seven college students
19 hanging out on the porch. A drug addict
20 running down threatening you in the middle of
21 the night. You know, come on. Garbage and
22 maggots and birds all over the place, rats in
23 your grill. I waited to get a Weber Grill for
24 30 years. Got a Weber grill, find a rat in it
25 in the Hollywood section.

1 There's something going on and I
2 don't understand why it's not being taken care
3 of. But I have all the proof here. If I was
4 sitting there, I'd want to see it. Thank you.
5 Mr. Lorince's e-mail address is wrong on the
6 new website. It still says dot com. I
7 understand it's supposed to say dot org. So
8 you can't get through to zoning via e-mail.

9 MS. URBAN: Hello. My name is Genna
10 Urban. I'm here tonight on behalf of the
11 Dunmore Pride Committee. So there's a group of
12 us that have been meeting. And we would like
13 to propose to the Borough that we have a
14 holiday get-together in Dunmore titled Home For
15 The Holidays in Bucktown.

16 We would like the Borough's
17 permission to use the Dunmore Corners for
18 having a tree lighting ceremony as well as
19 having crafts for the kids, bringing Santa into
20 the community, doing some pictures and caroling
21 as well. The proposal date is November 29th,
22 which would be the Sunday after Thanksgiving.

23 MR. VERRASTRO: Are you asking for
24 the road to be shut down for this?

25 MS. URBAN: No. We're just asking

1 for permission to conduct an event there. We
2 are not sure if we need a permit for vendors.
3 We're not sure if we would need insurance for
4 it. So we have permission to use both of the
5 lots and put a tree up in the lot and put a
6 tent in the lot that Dewey's used to be on --

7 MR. VERRASTRO: Can it be done down
8 here? Could it be done down here?

9 MS. URBAN: What we were trying to
10 do is bring back the community to the Dunmore
11 Corners. You know, as a child I grew up with
12 the Dunmore Festival going with my parents.
13 And I really never had an opportunity to bring
14 my kids there. So we're trying to get the
15 community involved and also promoting small
16 business Saturday the Saturday before the
17 event.

18 MR. VERRASTRO: I'm not trying to
19 give you a hard time. We don't own the parking
20 lot so we can't --

21 MS. URBAN: Right. We have
22 permission to use the lot. We have permission
23 to use the lots. You know, we're going to work
24 with the banks and hopefully have their
25 permission to use the parking on Sunday. So

1 we're just looking for permission to run the
2 event at the corners.

3 MR. DEMPSEY: I think it's a great
4 idea.

5 MR. MCHALE: I think it's a great
6 idea too.

7 MS. URBAN: I know Didge said maybe
8 he would help us with some stuff and also use,
9 you know, we'll definitely need some police
10 officers there and so forth. And we just think
11 it would be a great asset to our community and
12 really bringing back that Dunmore pride.

13 MR. MCHALE: That's a great idea.
14 Tommy, do they need anything that you know of?

15 ATTY. CUMMINGS: The only thing so
16 there's not a misunderstanding or unforeseen
17 liability, my impression is everybody in the
18 Borough, let alone everyone on Council is 100
19 percent in favor of it, you know, especially
20 the local vendors and the shopping and
21 everything.

22 My suggestion would be that Council
23 endorse it as a good idea this evening and then
24 we get -- just draft written proposal so if you
25 need something you know it ahead of time. And

1 if you need -- not just need in the sense of
2 permitting, but if we have to do an insurance
3 rider or, you know, some coordination with
4 PennDOT. There's a lot of different things
5 that could come up. So I would say before you
6 accept the liability for it, get it in writing
7 so we can hammer everything out. But endorse
8 it conceptually this evening. Is that okay?

9 MR. VERRASTRO: Like, there's not
10 going to be vendors selling stuff in front of
11 other stores and stuff like that, right?

12 MS. URBAN: No. We're just going to
13 promote the small business Saturday. We have
14 support of the businesses on the corners. They
15 are going to open on Sunday. And it's just
16 that there will be heavy foot traffic outside
17 and most of the events will take place outside
18 as well.

19 We're running this as a nonprofit.
20 We already filed for EIN and so forth. We're
21 moving forward in that direction. And we're
22 just looking for donations from the local
23 business to get this up and running.

24 MR. MCHALE: That's a great idea.
25 Tommy, do we do this in the form of a motion?

1 MR. VERRASTRO: I think we should
2 give them a contact person for now to give all
3 the information to us so just we can vote on it
4 after we have everything, correct?

5 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Yeah, if you want
6 to have a motion so you could voice your
7 opinion on it, that's fine. You just need to
8 endorse it conceptually and then instruct a
9 member of Council, me, Mr. Ruggiero, however
10 many you want to coordinate it so there is no
11 loose ends.

12 MR. VERRASTRO: I think we did
13 something similar like this with the block
14 parties all summer where they contacted Sal.
15 So this is basically a block party because it's
16 open to the public, correct?

17 MS. URBAN: Correct.

18 MR. VERRASTRO: So if you could get
19 in touch with our police chief and give him all
20 the information as the point person and maybe,
21 Sal, you could get it to Tommy and make sure if
22 there is any insurance or liability or things
23 that need to be done with it that we get our
24 suggestions from Tommy and get it taken care
25 of. This way it's quicker for you.

1 MS. URBAN: Okay. Great. So we
2 have the Borough's permission to move forward
3 with this?

4 MR. MCHALE: Absolutely.

5 MR. VERRASTRO: It's a great idea.
6 We want to make sure everybody understands
7 what's going on with it.

8 MR. MCHALE: Absolutely. And we'll
9 help any way we can.

10 MS. URBAN: Great. Thank you.

11 MR. MCHALE: Thank you.

12 MR. VERRASTRO: You could have Didge
13 all you want.

14 MR. MCHALE: Anybody else like to
15 speak tonight?

16 (No response.)

17 MR. MCHALE: Seeing none.

18 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Public officials.

19 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Marchese.

20 CHIEF MARCHESI: Nothing.

21 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Kearney?

22 MR. KEARNEY: Nothing.

23 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Judge.

24 MR. JUDGE: No.

25 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Ruggiero.

1 MR. RUGGIERO: No.

2 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Cummings.

3 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Nothing, sir.

4 MR. MCHALE: Do you want to lead us
5 off, Michael?

6 MR. DEMPSEY: Sure. I think that is
7 an awesome idea. If you need any help go
8 between me, Sal, Didge, or if you need my help
9 with anything. I know everybody is too. Hal
10 is particularly excited about it. For some
11 reason he called me saying he's going to serve
12 hot chocolate. That's true. He really did say
13 that. So great idea. Whatever you need.
14 Whatever we can do, I'm happy to do it.

15 And, Kelly, if I could talk to you
16 after the meeting to look at that stuff I'm
17 happy to do that as well. That's all I have.

18 MR. MCHALE: You know what, I'll go
19 second. Kelly, I have to get out of here right
20 afterwards. Can I meet you some night? I'll
21 come to your house. We'll go through them. I
22 just don't want to be rude. I have to get out
23 of here. My mother is a little ill. So I
24 apologize. Mr. Verrastro.

25 MR. VERRASTRO: Yeah, I would like

1 to start with I don't know if anybody noticed
2 but our firehouse is finally on its way. They
3 started construction on it, which is a good
4 thing. It's under a grant. It's within our
5 timelines for it. Kelly, I would like to look
6 at the stuff again. I mean, I didn't ignore
7 any of the stuff you gave me. I have read it.

8 I'm kind of keeping my opinion to
9 myself on it for now in public view, not to
10 give you any disrespect or anything. I need
11 certain things to run its course. I know you
12 don't want to hear that or think you should
13 have to hear that. Sometimes things need to
14 take its course through government for
15 everybody's protection.

16 So I don't like to say too many
17 things about that that could either harm
18 myself, you, or the Borough just because I gave
19 an opinion that might hurt somebody in some
20 way, shape or form. But I apologize for that.
21 And I'll explain it to you more in depth when
22 I'm one-on-one with you.

23 I'd like to thank everybody for
24 coming. I had a couple more things but it kind
25 of slipped my mind for right now. So have a

1 good night.

2 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Burke.

3 MR. BURKE: I would like go over the
4 paperwork with you. If I give you my number I
5 can't do it tonight because I have to be
6 somewhere right after the meeting.

7 MS. HALLINAN: I can scan them like
8 I did with the other documents.

9 MR. MCHALE: I'll come to your
10 house. You're two blocks away from me.

11 MS. HALLINAN: I can scan and then
12 send them to Vito for whoever wanted them.

13 MR. BURKE: That would be great.
14 Thank you. Joe, did you get a chance to check
15 the situation Jake brought up?

16 MR. LORINCE: Yeah, I gave him
17 the -- I looked back into the abandonment and
18 that alley was abandoned, what was it 1998?

19 MR. MCHALE: Joe, that road is added
20 to the liquid fuels I'm told now --

21 MR. GARBOLINO: -- pathetic.
22 Pathetic. 100 and some years ago, the Borough
23 of Dunmore ordained that piece of property, 100
24 and some years ago. And if you people are not
25 getting liquid fuels then you better go get

1 liquid fuel because you're entitled to them.

2 MR. MCHALE: I spoke to you the
3 other day, Mr. Garbolino. And I did leave a
4 note. Joe wasn't in his office at the time. I
5 am taking care of that after you and I spoke
6 this past week.

7 MR. GARBOLINO: All right. Thank
8 you.

9 MR. MCHALE: You got it.

10 MR. BURKE: Anything I could do too,
11 Genna, to help out. Great idea. Good luck
12 with it. That's all I have tonight.

13 MR. MCHALE: I'm jumping around but,
14 guys, anything you need. When someone left
15 stuff in our mailbox I thought it was a great
16 idea. And Hal had a similar thought on a
17 different season, but anything you need. We'll
18 help personally and all of us together. Please
19 let us know. Anybody else have anything?

20 (No response.)

21 MR. MCHALE: Look for a motion to
22 adjourn.

23 MR. DEMPSEY: Motion.

24 MR. VERRASTRO: I'll second it.

25 MR. MCHALE: All in favor signify by

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saying aye.

ALL MEMBERS: Aye.
